

## WACMA MEETING May 2, 2006

- Secretary's Report:** Minutes approved.  
Sue motioned to accept, Dawn seconded.
- Treasurers Report:** Report handed out. Bills are paid, still waiting for a couple of fundraiser payments. Still need to adjust funds since transfers from student accounts were made to cover fundraiser checks. Estimated profit from fundraiser is \$2888.60.  
We were only short a few items and they were delivered the next day. We have on paid and one unpaid order not yet picked up. Directors hav  
Their reports and student accounts have been credited.  
Fundraisers of this type are a "bookkeeping nightmare" due to all the different profit amounts on all the items sold. In the future we need to get a spreadsheet from the vendor to help calculate the student profits.
- Orchestra Report:** State went very well. Thirteen entries received a "1" and twelve entrie received a "2".

All City Chorus went very well, numbers are getting smaller.

- Band Report:** Barb Lisser came to the meeting as the Band Liaison.  
Concert & Banquet on May 17<sup>th</sup>. They will distribute tickets at the door this year instead of mailing them out.  
Band will play in the Memorial Day Parade and at Graduation.  
Band will also play in the Centennial Parade on June 15<sup>th</sup>.

The Band is also trying to get more parent volunteers involved. They are asking each Board member to bring one person to their meeting. They are currently holding their meetings in a private home and will start having them at school in hopes more people would feel comfortable coming to the school or a meeting rather than a home. They will be losing many people due to seniors graduating and need to get more parents involved to lighten the load on each person.

**Scholarships:** \$3,377.50 was given out in scholarships. Two Educator Scholarships for \$500.00 each, two for Band Camp, one for Strolling Strings, and the rest for various summer music lessons.
