Orchestra Report: Busy working on Solo & Ensemble

Band Report: UW Band will not cancel and will perform as scheduled at our school on April 6th.

Ticket deadline already passed, they will sell tickets at the door. Band thanks WACMA for their contribution towards the advertising expense.

In order to have the UW Band come here to perform they are paid a performance fee (roughly \$3,300.00), their busses and food are paid for as well as the rental of risers and shells. A set amount of 50% of the money made from tickets sales and food goes to the Band for the purchase of instruments.

Choir Report: Busy working on Solo & Ensemble

Solo & Ensemble Medals:

The District does not intend that parents/students pay for medals for Solo & Ensemble; they do have money for this expense. Some schools may have charged their students for this expense and those students will be reimbursed. It was suggested that the money just be put in the student accounts, rather than trying to give refunds. This could be a problem for seniors who may not get to use this money for anything else. It would be the Directors' choice how to handle the refunds. Central parents/students were not charged for medals.

Solo & Ensemble will be at Hale again this year. Do we know who is doing the food, at this point we can assume Hale is doing it? Why does Hale always get to do the food, even when it is at our school? We need to contact the person in charge of these arrangements and see if we can benefit from the sale of food also. Dawn will find out who we need to talk to. We would like to invite this person to our next meeting and discuss the situation. We had Solo & Ensemble at Central for many years so now Hale is hosting it for several years in a row.

Diane mentioned that Hale is not a good location for Solo & Ensemble. It is too noisy, you can spread things out at Central much better with the 3 floors.

Kringle Sale: All orders will be due on Tuesday, March 8th since there is no school on Monday, March 7th. Pick-up date is Monday, March 21st from 3:00 to 7:00 p.m. Dawn will send out a half-sheet reminder for the pick-up.
